Central Institute of Hindi i.e. Kendriya Hindi Sansthan is an autonomous educational institute governed by an autonomous organization **Kendriya Hindi Shikshan Mandal (KHSM)** which was established in 1961 by the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India.

The Headquarter of Sansthan is situated at Agra. It has eight Centres: Delhi (1970), Hyderabad (1976), Guwahati (1978), Shillong (1987), Mysore (1988), Dimapur (2003), Bhubaneswar (2003) and Ahmedabad (2006) established respectively. Hindi works as a vital link for national integration in India. The Institute imbibes this characteristic of Hindi in all its activities. The Institute has been oriented to realize this goal through its various disciplines and the programmes organized there. In this background the Institute has put some objectives in its memorandum. These can be enshrined as following-

Objectives of KHSM

- (i) To realize the constitutional obligation mentioned in section 351, the Institute works for the development of Hindi as an all India Language and make an attempt to prepare, organize and implement such types of the courses which can help to attain this broad objective.
- (ii) To improve the standards of teaching Hindi at various levels, to train Hindi teachers, to provide avenues for the advanced study of Hindi language and literature and Comparative Linguistics related to different Indian languages, to organize research in the teaching of the subject, to formulate, undertake and facilitate such courses.
- (iii) To establish, supervise and control hostels for the residence of the students
- (iv) To hold examinations and grant diploma for various courses.
- (v) To prepare suitable text books, reference books and research oriented books for different levels of Hindi Teaching and learning.
- (vi) To publish journals and magazines according to the goals of the Institute.
- (vii) To subscribe or become member or to cooperate with other associations with the Institutes working with similar objectives or to extend them affiliation, if required.
- (viii) By time to time, promoting the application of Hindi according to the given rules by providing Fellowships, Scholarships, Awards and Medals.

Activities of the Institute

In order to realize the above mentioned goals and objectives Central Institute of Hindi has continuously expanded its activities. The details are as follows-

1. Teaching-related Courses

(A) Hindi Teaching for Foreign Students

The Head Quarter, Agra and Delhi Centre organize following courses for the foreign students under the scheme for Propagation of Hindi Abroad and cultural exchange –

(i)	Hindi Language Proficiency Certificate Course	-	100
(ii)	Hindi Language Proficiency Diploma	-	200
(iii)	Hindi Language Proficiency Advanced Diploma	-	300
(iv)	Post Graduate Hindi Diploma	-	400

These courses (1 to 3) are conducted at Delhi Centre under self-financing scheme. All these courses are also being run in Colombo and kandy, Sri Lanka through ICCR.

(B) Evening Courses (Self-Financed)

The Head Quarter and at its Delhi Centre run the following courses –

- (i) **Post M.A. Diploma in Applied Hindi Linguistics**
- (ii) **PG Diploma in Translation Theory and Practice**
- (iii) **PG Diploma in Mass communication and Journalism**

2. Teacher Training Programmes

Teacher Training Programmes for the students of Non Hindi States

The Department of Teacher Education at its Headquarter as well as at its Centres organizes a number of one year and two Years Programme for Hindi Teachers of Non-Hindi States and for the students willing to learn Hindi. The courses are as follows:

- (i) **Hindi Shikshan Nishnat**- Equivalent to M.Ed. (Agra) (two years)

- (ii) **Hindi Shikshan Parangat**- Equivalent to B.Ed. (Agra) (two years)
- (iii) **Hindi Shikshan Praveen**- Equivalent to D.El.Ed.(Agra Centre) (two years)
- (iv) **Three year Hindi Teaching Diploma course**-This course is organized for starting two years in Dimapur (Nagaland) but the final year students compulsorily visit and stay at Agra Headquarter to complete the aforesaid diploma.
- (v) **Intensive Hindi Teaching Training Course (Dimapur)** -This course is designed for the untrained Hindi Teachers of North-East states.

3. Refresher and Enrichment Programme

The Institute runs refresher programme for the teachers of Non-Hindi states in guidance of Department of Orientation and Extension Programmes and Academic Co-ordinator office at the Headquarter. The Department of Orientation and Extension Programmes at the Headquarter organizes 30 days language enrichment programme for the students of Government Hindi Teachers Training colleges of Gujrat, Karnataka, Assam, Mizoram and Manipur. The Department also runs 21 days orientation programme for Sikkim state in Agra. All the Centres of Kendriya Hindi Sansthan conduct orientation programmes for the teachers deputed by the State Govt. The details are as follows-

Dimapur Centre	-	For the Hindi Teachers of Nagaland & Manipur
Bhubaneswar Centre	-	For the Hindi Teachers of Orissa and Chhattisgarh
Ahmedabad Centre	-	For the Hindi Teachers of Gujarat, Daman and Diu, Dadra and Nagar Haveli

4. Research Oriented Programme

One of the important objectives of Institute is to focus on research works in the following areas-

- Research for the development of latest methodologies of Hindi teaching
- Comparative & Contrastive study between Hindi Language and other Indian Languages
- Fundamental and Applied research in the field of Hindi language and Literature
- Research for the development of language technology and modernization of Hindi Language
- Socio-Linguistics surveys and studies of Hindi
- Research on Functional Hindi

Sansthan also develops suitable teaching materials for Hindi as a Second and Foreign language during these research oriented programmes.

5. Production of Teaching Material & Language Development

Apart from Teaching-Training & Research work, Kendriya Hindi Sansthan develops material for Hindi Teaching with latest technique for the students of Non-Hindi States.

- Production of Hindi teaching materials for the schools of Non-Hindi States & Tribal areas.
- Production of contrastive grammar of Hindi bilingual learners' dictionaries for Non-Hindi States.
- Production of Hindi teaching books as a foreign language.
- Production of computer based language teaching material.
- Production of Hindi Teaching material through Audio-visual method.
- Production of bilingual/trilingual dictionaries of Hindi and other Indian languages

(A) Publication

The Publication Division of Sansthan has published a number of books on various subjects such as Hindi Language and Literature, Applied Linguistics, Comparative and Contrastive Linguistics, Language and Literature teaching, Lexicography, Bilingual Dictionaries etc. about 300 books have been published so far by the institute. Textbooks of multiple purposes at different levels and teacher guides have also been published. Sansthan is also publishing following journals and magazines-

- (i) **Gaveshna**- A quarterly journal of applied linguistics, Hindi teaching and criticism
- (ii) **Samvad Path**- A quarterly journal of mass communication and journalism

- (viii) **Bhavak** – Hindi literature : A quarterly magazine on diverse dimensions of creation and thought

- Monthly Bulletin of Sansthan- **Sansthan Samachar**.

Apart for these, the annual students' magazines of the department of International Hindi Teaching and the department of Teacher Education. -**Hindi Vishva Bharti** and **Samanvay** are also published.

(B) Major Projects

Some of the major projects of the Institute are as follows:

1. **Bhasha Sahitya C.D. Nirman Pariyojna:** Under this project production of the educational audio-visual programmes are to be prepared for students and common people, who are interested in Hindi. Multimedia programmes of Hindi language teaching are also being prepared. So far, Audio CD's on **Suryakant Tripathi 'Nirala', Agyeya, Trilochan & Firak Gorakhpuri** have been prepared. An educational documentary titled: **Panth Hone Do Aparichit** on the life and works of Mahadevi Verma has been produced. Besides, another film on the life and works of **Nazeer Akbarabadi** is under the last phase of production.
2. **Hindi Lok shabdkosh Pariyojna:** Hindi Lokshabd Kosh Project is being sum in order to preserve the linguistic heritage of rich but endangered dialects of Hindi Language. In view of Cultural and social importance of the dialects & Hindi Language there is a plan for the publication and digitization of 17 dialects. It will be available on the internet. Bhojpuri - Hindi, English, Rajasthan - Hindi-English and Braj-Hindi-English dictionaries have been published.
3. **Hindi Vishwa Kosh Pariyojna** – Under this project 'Hindi Encyclopedia' is being prepared in 16 volumes comprising different subject fields. Two volumes 'Earth' and Geography and 'Mathematics' have been published.

6. Extension Programmes

- (i) To organize **Special Extension Lectures** and **Workshops** in view of contact, co-ordination and exchange of ideas at the Headquarter and its centres
- (ii) To organize National Seminars on Linguistics, Hindi Literature, Hindi Teaching, Journalism, Language Terminology, Media etc. at the Headquarter and its centres every year for greater linguistic and cultural exchange at all India level
- (iii) To organize all India Hindi debate competition essay writing and poetry recitation for trainees of the Hindi Teaching Training Colleges and propagation Institute of Non-Hindi State
- (iv) To organize cultural competition such as folk music, dance and short play of various regions and countries of the world for the students
- (v) To organize small budgetary seminars by the Headquarter and at its centres with the support of regional colleges
- (vi) To support the town official language implementation committee and other Hindi teaching institutions

7. Hindi Sevi Samman Yojana

This plan was initiated in 1989. Sansthan awards 26 Hindi scholars selected from all over India for their remarkable works regarding Promotion, Propagation and Development of Hindi at National and International level. The selected scholars are awarded with a token prize of Rs. Five lakh in cash, shawl and Bronze plaque for their contribution. The details of these awards are as given below-

8. Library

Sansthan has one of the best specialized collections of books on Linguistics, Applied Linguistics, Language teaching and Hindi Literature. The Library has a collection of 78,000 books, 2,100 hard bound journals and about 79 journals (research and others) are purchased to library every month. The reference section of library is exclusive. A week long exhibition and literary discussion is conducted on the birth anniversary of the poets/authors. All the Regional centres have also good arrangement of library and reading room.

9. Management

Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra established in 1961 is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. It is governed by Kendriya Hindi Shikshan Mandal. Hon'ble Cabinet Minister of the Ministry of Education is the Ex-officio Chairman of KHSM. The Mandal has a Vice chairman and Secretary. The Director of KHS is the Ex-officio Secretary of KHSM as well as the Head of the Institute. Various HODs, Regional Directors of centres, Registrar, Deputy Registrar, Accounts Officer, Administrative Officer (Academic & Administration) and Librarian work under the Director and perform their relevant duties. Sufficient strength of employees both in academic as well as administrative group are appointed with them.

10. Campus of the Sansthan

The Headquarter of Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra is situated at Agra. **Main Building, Gandhi Bhawan, Moturi Satya Narayan Hostel, Premchand Hostel, Mahadevi Verma International Women's Hostel, Subhadra Kumari Chauhan Hostel and Atal Bihari Vajpayee International Hall** are well managed. Besides there is a **Guest House and Residential Quarters** for the members of the Institute. In addition to the Head Quarter, Delhi, Mysore, Hyderabad and Shillong centres are being run in newly constructed their own buildings.

11. Training Colleges affiliated to the Sansthan

In order to improve the level of Hindi teaching training and bring uniformity in the course structure, the Hindi Teacher Training Colleges of North Guwahati (Assam), Aizwal (Mizoram) and Dimapur (Nagaland) are affiliated to the Institute. The courses of Sansthan are implemented by these colleges.

General Introduction to Evening Courses

The aim of Evening Courses is to train such students who have been either working somewhere or are unable to seek admission in regular day courses due to some other engagements. The academic programmes among the Evening Courses are as follows:

1. Post M.A. Diploma in Applied Hindi Linguistics (Agra and Delhi)

In this programme the learners get the basic knowledge of the principles of General Linguistics on one hand and a vast knowledge of Hindi Grammar and Hindi structures along with different aspects of Social Contexts of Hindi, on the other hand. As the fourth question paper of the course, students can be benefited from the study of applied areas of linguistics by selecting any one of the four alternative papers.

1. To provide information about the principles and applications of linguistics.
2. To familiarize the students with structure of Hindi Language and Socio-Linguistic aspects of Hindi.
3. To introduce with special study of specific areas of applied linguistics.

Eligibility:

- (b) Hindi as one of the subject or medium of instruction at graduation level.

2. Post Graduate Diploma in Translation Theory and Practice (Agra and Delhi)

This course is especially useful for those students who want to make their career in the field of translation or develop their interest in the field of translation and want to put themselves in the translation job. Under this course, students gain the proficiency to translate from Hindi to English and vice-versa.

Objectives

1. To make the learner proficient in Translation skills after developing expertise in linguistic techniques.
2. To introduce Translation Theory in detail.
3. To familiarize with the new techniques of Translation and to develop the ability of Translation Evaluation.
4. To develop the translation ability from English to Hindi as a source and target language and vice versa.

3. P.G. Diploma in Mass Communication and Journalism (Available in Agra and Delhi)

This course is prepared for those students who want to opt journalism and mass communication as their profession. This course gives ample information on topics related to 'electronic media'. It communicates with the issues of print media as well. This course also familiarize the students with different facets of writing and editing skills.

Objectives :

1. To familiarize with the different aspects of mass media.
2. To give special emphasis on Hindi structure of Hindi Journalism.
3. To develop the ability of the event analysis.
4. To Aware and motivate towards the moral and diverse responsibilities of the communication mediums.
5. Provide plenary information about the all-round elements of study, teaching, research, training and publication of topics related to social media.
6. To conduct training programs for the uses of cyber journalism.

Note : The annual examination will be of 70 marks, 20 Marks for project work and 10 marks for internal assessment.

ELIGIBILITY

- (1) Graduation in any subject from any recognized University.
- (2) Hindi as a subject or medium of instruction at the graduation level.

Basis of Admission

Admission will be on the basis of written examination only. Written Examination will be of 100 Marks.

General Instructions for Admission

1. The original degree and certificates are to be produced at the time of admission.
2. Candidates who are in service are required to produce 'no objection certificate' form their office.
3. Fee once deposited will not be refunded in any case.
- Reservation rules will be followed as per Govt. of India policy.

Duration of the Evening Courses and Annual Examination.

1. The duration of the evening courses in one academic year is 15 July—15 May.
2. Annual Examination will be held in April-May.
3. 80% attendance is compulsory for appearing in the annual examination.

Examination Rule

1. The examination of the Institute will be held on scheduled date at Headquarter Agra and Delhi centre. For this, the rules of various programs prescribed by the Institute time to time would be applicable.
2. It will be compulsory to fill up the application form by 15th December in order to appear in the annual examination.
3. In case of lost/defect of annual examination form, duplicate form can be obtained by depositing Rs. 100.
4. Only those students will be admitted in the examination whose attendance is 80% of the total working days.
5. The categories of divisions in all examinations are as follows - (1) First class - 60% and above (2) Second class - 50% and above (3) Third class - 40% and above.
If a student obtains 75% or more, the certificate of the student will be honoured with the mention of 'First division with Distinction'.
6. In order to pass the examination it is mandatory to obtain a minimum 40% mark in each subject.
7. Grace marks will only be awarded if a student secures 40% marks in aggregate in all subjects. In the deserving case, a grace of 05 marks will be given. The grace marks can be divided in two subjects as per requirement. The grace marks will be applicable only for the written examination, not in the practical examination.

8. For the improvement of division, 01 mark will be awarded. However, in any case the division improvement mark and grace marks will not be given together.
9. A student will not be allowed to appear in the Supplementary examination if he or she fails in more than two subjects.
10. No grace marks will be given in the supplementary examination of the evening courses.
11. If a student wants to get his/her answer sheets re-evaluated, the student will have to apply for the re-evaluation within 15 days of receiving marksheet in the same year. For this, Rs. 500 / - will have to be deposited as fee. This facility can be availed for maximum two papers.
12. One opportunity for supplementary examination will be given to those students who fail in two papers. Rs. 500/- per paper will have to be paid for supplementary examination. The supplementary examination will be held in the same year in the month of October-November. In order to appear in supplementary examination a student can get an application form by writing a request letter to Examination Controller, Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra. The last date for submitting the form will be between 15th to 30th September. It is the responsibility of the student to get the form and submit it on the given time. In order to get examination form, an envelope of 23x15 cm size (affixed with Rs 50/ postal stamp) must be sent along with request letter.
13. Records related to entrance and annual examination for example- answer sheets, additional papers, rejected application form will be kept for three years. After that there will be destroyed.
14. Anomalies related to marksheet and certificate of annual examination will be resolved within one year from the date of declaration of the result.
15. If a candidate fails to appear in the examination due to medical reasons after filling up the application form and gives immediate information to the institute, then he/she will be allowed to fill the fresh application for the next examination. The opportunity will be valid for one year only. The candidate will have to produce certificate by a certified doctor.
16. If a candidate is unwell during the examination and requires helper (writer) for writing his/her paper, the academic qualification of the helper must be less than the admission qualification of the candidate.
17. If a student is found doing unfair means (cheating etc.) during the examination, the decision taken by the Disciplinary Committee will be final and obligatory. All legal matters will be subject to the Agra judicial area.
18. In case of absence of practical and oral examination and non-submission of dissertation/project work within the stipulated time, the examinee will be declared failed and no opportunity will be provided for the same.
19. For the fees of duplicate copy of marksheet and certificate issued by the Institute are rupees 200/- and 400/- respectively.

Important Information

1. All the information given in the application form must be correct and should be based on certificates.
2. In order to get admission in a course, it is essential to submit self-attested photo copies of original certificates, provisional certificates and marksheet of the final year. The application form will be rejected if photo is not affixed.
3. Application form must contain a list of all the documents and certificates attached.
